### Trip to ITV studios to interview Carolyn McCall









Last month **Safaa**, **Rafih**, **Vlad** and **Archie** from Years 3 and 4 were invited to the ITV studios to interview Carolyn McCall, the CEO of ITV. We were asked to go by UNICEF because they had seen all the wonderful work we are doing as part of our Rights Respecting School status.

Our mission was to discuss Soccer Aid and the Rights with Carolyn - in particular the Right to Play - as part of her monthy vlocast to be broadcast to all ITV staff. The aim was that, through this activity, staff working at ITV on the Soccer Aid for Unicef broadcast would better understand the impact of the event and our work with children's rights, especially the right to play.

The children really enjoyed interviewing Carolyn, discussing the Rights and learning about all the work that goes on behind the scenes when filming. It was a great opportunity for the children to develop their communication skills, share their knowledge, increase their confidence and have their voices heard.

Soccer Aid is a football match during which a range of celebrities play against each other. This year the match will take place at the Chelsea Football Club stadium, Stamford Bridge. Footballers such as Rachel Yankey, Didier Drogba, Joe Cole, Harry and Jamie Rednapp, will be competing against athletes such as SirMo Farah and Usain Bolt, as well as celebrities including Piers Morgan, Ben Shepherd and Susanna Reid. All the money raised from the sale of tickets will be matched by the UK Government to help make sure more than 80,000 children in Sierra Leone and Zambia can have a childhood full of play.

As an **Enterprise** and **Rights Respecting School**, we focus on one Skill and one Right every month and our weekly 'Thoughts', generated by our pupils, underpin these overarching themes.

The 'Thought' is introduced in assembly on a Monday and children are celebrated for their work and achievements that may be linked to the Skill or Right of the Month in Golden Assembly every Friday. All children are encouraged to share their ideas for the 'Thought for the Week'. William Tyndale School is proud to be going into the second year of Islington's Trauma Informed Practice in Schools programme (ITIPS). This two-year programme involves several Islington primary and secondary schools working to ensure their learning environment supports the most vulnerable children. The programme enables schools to explore further the ways in which difficult experiences can affect children's development; children are enabled to express their emotions in healthy ways. The aim of the programme is to help build resilience for all children as well as our most vulnerable.

So far, we have worked with focus groups comprising pupils, staff and a small group of parents and carers; staff questionnaires have identified strengths and areas for development, which will feed into our school development planning for next year. The whole staff body has received training as well as hosting and attending borough wide network meetings to share good practice.

This links nicely with lots of our other initiatives, for example being a Rights Respecting School, a Healthy School and our approach to inclusion and diversity, amongst others. We look forward to keeping you updated in future.
