Year 4 Primary Engineers and Mars Rovers!

Congratulations to all of Year 4! They have just completed an incredible engineering project in collaboration with Primary Engineers and link engineers, Robin and Kaishan from Greater Anglia Trains.

The children worked in teams to design and build a Mars Rover. They built their wooden chassis using saws and then wired them with batteries, a motor, gears and a 'remote controlled' switch – all made from scratch! The rovers were able to travel forwards and backwards and the gears and tyres they added also meant that they were able to climb a slope. It was very hard work and very fiddly at times but everyone showed great positivity, determination and teamwork to be able to get a working model by the end.

On Thursday 20th, two groups from each class took part in a celebration event with six other schools. We were very proud of Archie, Atticus, Batu, Ella, Gabriel, Milo, Renata, Scarlett, Sophia, Spike, Tom and Zaynab for the incredible presentation skills that they demonstrated. They presented their portfolios and their rovers were tested for how well they could travel in a straight line and how far they could travel up an incline. Particular congratulations go to Atticus, Sophia and Zaynab, who won 'Best Themed Project' and Ella, Gabriel and Tom, who won 'Best Primary Engineers'!

The engineers hosting the event were particularly impressed that all sixty children in Year 4 had participated in the project and they were blown away by the enthusiasm and clarity with which the groups at the celebration event presented their work. One said: 'I think it's time for me to retire now and let the next generation of engineers take over!' Well done everyone!





MAYOR OF LONDON – RE:CODE London

On Wednesday 1st July, Year 5 attended an exciting event held at Imagination Lab in Lambeth.

RE:CODE London events give young Londoners aged 9-11 the chance to take on a real-life coding challenge. The aim is to build coding and creative problem-solving skills.

After arriving at Imagination Lab, both classes were taken to be shown a demonstration of the kind of thing they would be doing. The theme was animals so the children were encouraged to be creative to decide how they were going to make it move.

Once in the lab, all children wasted no time getting stuck into the activity. Soon all teams had surpassed expectations and were creating incredible models. The next step was to code the instructions using iPads, making their creations flap, crawl, flip, spin and even make noises! 


