Activities included: cloud gazing; plant identification; painting; role play; developing physical skills and solving the mystery of the missing bear!


















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Flag Bee






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World Cultural Diversity Day





EYFS and KS1 created wonderful, bright and vibrant artwork inspired by Alma Thomas









Deloitte Futures Month

The William Tyndale debate team were lucky enough to be part of a competition hosted by Deloitte. The challenge presented was to pitch an idea to help solve one of three problems: to help climate change, to solve local community problems or to use technology positively.

We split into groups and decided which problem to address. After coming up with an idea, we spent time preparing our pitch and practising our presentation skills. Once we had fully prepared, we signed on to an online meeting with Deloitte employees. To warm up to our pitches we played a game of where do you stand; the rules of this game are to stand on a side of the room that indicates your opinion on the motion given. We were then asked to explain our arguments and give thoughts and evidence to back up our points.

We also enjoyed a Q&A with the volunteers from Deloitte, in which we found out information about their careers. We asked about the teamwork skills they use in their day-to-day work experience, the highlights of their job and how they came to work at Deloitte.

Once we had learnt about them, it was time for us to present our ideas. The teams took turns to pitch their solution to any of the three problems. We were given a structure of what we needed to mention. Each member of the groups took a turn to explain a feature of the idea practising persuasive language skills all the while.

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The ideas presented were all very creative and lots of time and effort was put in. At the end of the speeches, each team member was given individual feedback about their performance and the improvements to be made which was beneficial as we learnt new skills.

The four teams from William Tyndale came up with these creative ideas:

One team pitched a robotic fish that swims in the sea and collects water which it will then filter through, keeping the micro plastics within its stomach and expelling the excess water to power it.

Another team thought of an idea to put barcodes on supermarket products that, once scanned on a phone app, shows the carbon footprint of the item.

One team thought of putting a turbine underneath every paving stone that, once stepped on, spun the turbine and created electricity to power all electric objects.

The last team pitched a food/water/clothes bank that is on wheels and gives out its resources to those in need.

We really enjoyed our session with Deloitte, learning new skills and working in teams.



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ESPRESSO HOME ACCESS

Espresso Home Access is filled with wonderful resources across all subject areas for children to access from home. Please follow the instructions on how to get into all the great material. Open a webpage and type in https://www.discoveryeducation.co.uk/



Type in the username and password that your class teacher has given you. If you have forgotten it, please ask.



Click on espresso and you are able to access all of the resources. There are fantastic activities, videos and printable resources for all year groups. You can use espresso on both PCs and iPads. Some activities require Adobe flash.

All children from Year 1 upwards have an individual Reading Eggs password. Please ask your class teacher if you need your password.

Doodle Maths is an app that allows children to practise their mathematical skills independently, both in school and at home. **Doodle Maths** works by assessing areas of maths that children complete easily or find challenging; it then re-assigns questions to teach children new mathematical learning in small steps.

Your child has been given a **username** and **password**, and has been shown how to log in and use **Doodle Maths**.

It is very important that children complete the activities on **Doodle Maths** independently so that the app can assess which areas they need further practice in. Please do not help your children by giving them the answers, but direct them to the hints and explanations that can be found in the help section at the top of each question.

To link with your child's account, follow these simple steps:

- Download the **Doodle Maths** app;
- Ask your child to sign in, using the details they have been given;
- Tap on the Grown Ups section and follow the instructions there to link yourself to your child;
- Login to www.parents.doodlemaths.com with your Grown Ups username and password and click on Monitor Live so you can see how your child is doing as they complete their exercise; and
- Download the Parent Connect app where you can see a snapshot of what your child is doing. Encourage your child/ren to earn at least 50 Doodle Stars a week and get instant updates through your app.
