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
Year 4 Trip to Science Museum

Year 2 Roman Workshop



This week, Year 2 classes took part in a Roman workshop. The children explored the history of Britannia before and after the Roman invasion. They also had a chance to look at Roman artefacts, played Delta (a Roman numeral, maths-based game), a Roman quiz, participated in a display of Roman and Celtic weapons and armour and played Boudicca's final battle with the Romans. The day finished with a gladiator show! It was an incredible day full of learning!



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National Numeracy Day

On Wednesday 17th May, we celebrated National Numeracy Day. Each year group focused on a particular maths activity aimed to increase enthusiasm and confidence in number. There were children making number bonds to 10, using the giant Numicon. Groups went outside where they gathered flowers to measure and completed a maths based activity trail around the playground. We watched the live lesson hosted by Katya Jones and Bobby Seagull as well as entering the Number Heroes competition, which asked children to describe their dream job and how it would use numbers. Some children played a variety of challenging maths games that involved logical thinking, teamwork and perseverance. On their school trip, Year 5 learned about pounds, shillings and pence. It was wonderful to see all the enthusiasm for maths around the school.



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Today, classes Cashapona and Theobroma set off on a convivial Victorian journey to the Ragged School Museum. After a short walk to the Overground Station and a train ride, we arrived at a Victorian building which was once a warehouse used to store goods such as lime juice. It was tinged a light green colour and we all buzzed with excitement.

We entered the building to be greeted by coarse, splintered Victorian school desks and wooden mahogany floorboards. Both classes were guided downstairs to put our belongings away, before being escorted to our first session. At first, Cashapona got to meet a kind woman called Romy, who expanded our knowledge on the Victorians by conversing about the Ragged School Museum. We were very lucky to have this opportunity to know more about the Industrial Revolution.

While Cashapona was talking to Romy, Theobroma on the other hand, were not having that much fun. They were experiencing the Victorian lifestyle. We swapped sessions so we all experienced school life. There was an actor who was very knowledgeable about the Victorians. She was acting, and she expected us to act along. She was very strict but, what a great way to learn about the Victorians! We had to get the proper education of a Victorian child while being treated like them as well. The boys and girls were then separated into two rows and then children were chosen to hand out slates and chalk. But for the left handed children, writing wasn't that easy! Victorians thought it was a sign of the devil! Our Victorian teacher presented a long list of words for us to copy down and memorise so that it will apply when we are to get a "Victorian job." Victorian school expectations included: sitting up straight with good posture; using your right hand; neat handwriting; no elbows on the table; and hands on your lap!

We are all pleased to not be Victorian children, and we LOVED this trip!

DID YOU KNOW?

- Fewer than half of all children and young people in the UK (47%) are meeting the Chief Medical Officer guidelines of taking part in 60 minutes of sport and physical activity per day (Sport England, 2022).
- Almost a quarter (23.4%) of children in the UK are obese by the time they reach Year 6 (NCMP, 2022).
- There is a positive association between levels of sport and physical activity and young peoples' mental wellbeing, resilience, community development and reduced loneliness (Sport England, 2022).
- 91% of primary aged pupils say being active helps them learn (spear, 2021).
- There is a positive link between physical activity and emotional regulation. Physical activity positively predicts academic achievement through self-regulation (Vasilopoulos et al. 2021).
 Make the <u>#PledgeToPlay</u> today and commit to getting children and young people in your care ac-

tive for a minimum of 60 minutes a day during National School Sports Week.



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Reading and Maths Resources

All children from Year 1 upwards have an individual Reading Eggs password. Please ask your class teacher if you need your password.

All children from Year 1 upwards receive a login to Doodle Maths.

Doodle Maths is an app that allows children to practise their mathematical skills independently, both in school and at home. **Doodle Maths** works by assessing areas of maths that children complete easily or find challenging; it then re-assigns questions to teach children new mathematical learning in small steps.

Your child has been given a **username** and **password**, and has been shown how to log in and use **Doodle Maths**. It is very important that children complete the activities on **Doodle Maths** independently so that the app can assess which areas they need further practice in. Please do not help your children by giving them the answers, but direct them to the hints and explanations that can be found in the help section at the top of each question.

To link with your child's account, follow these simple steps:

- Download the **Doodle Maths** app;
- Ask your child to sign in, using the details they have been given;
- Tap on the Grown Ups section and follow the instructions there to link yourself to your child;
- Login to <u>www.parents.doodlemaths.com</u> with your Grown Ups username and password and click on Monitor Live so you can see how your child is doing as they complete their exercise; and
- Download the Parent Connect app where you can see a snapshot of what your child is doing. Encourage your child/ren to earn at least 50 Doodle Stars a week and get instant updates through your app.
