We know that bullying is a rarity at William Tyndale and are pleased that the vast majority of children who have experienced bullying have had a swift resolution. However, we are not complacent and will continue to work to ensure that any incidents are resolved effectively.

In order to help us with this, please do look at the Anti-Bullying Policy (an appendix of the <u>Behav-iour Policy</u>). We were concerned about the response figures in this question as they did not match our records; this may be either due to a misunderstanding of the definition of bullying or because we were not contacted about some incidents. In line with the Department for Education, our bullying definition states:

'Bullying is when you deliberately keep making someone unhappy. You know you are bullying when you are choosing to hurt or upset someone with unkind words or actions again and again.'

Whilst instances of children being unkind to one another are never tolerated and always addressed, bullying constitutes a repeated pattern of this.

She will work alongside your children's teachers to think about how the service can best support the school and all the children.

Every class made a class charter last month! A class charter is a democratically agreed contract created by the class and their teacher. Each class decided on which rights and responsibilities they thought were the most important to ensure the class is a safe and respectful learning space. 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This month we will be learning about the Right to Be Listened to. Every class will be watching The Big Anti Bullying Assembly, which links to every child's right to be heard and be safe. Each class will also be taking part in a lesson on climate change where they will get the chance to vote on whether they think climate change affects children's needs and rights.

Opticians

Have you noticed that your child is having difficulty seeing bus numbers or reading? Are they complaining of headaches? They may be struggling to see clearly in class. It might be worth arranging for a trip to an optician. We have seen a few children who benefitted from having their vision checked. If you think that this may be the case for your child, please do book an appointment. If possible, arrange for the appointment to be out of school time to minimise disruption to their learning. Secondary Transfer 2022

If your child is in Year 6, now is the time to think about applying for Secondary schools. The Secondary Transfer brochure is available on the Islington website – go to <u>www.islington.gov.uk/</u> <u>admissions</u>

The closing date for applications is **31st October 2021**. Islington Council recommend that you apply by **18th October** in case there are any problems.

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Why do we have an extra day of the Half Term on Friday 22nd October?

The Government has announced an extra Bank Holiday on 3rd June 2022, in recognition of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. The day falls in many schools' summer half term break, including ours. In these cases the Government has reduced the number of school days to 189, allowing an extra day of holiday during the academic year. At William Tyndale, we are going to add a day onto the Autumn Half Term; the result of this will be that school will **finish at 3.30pm on Thursday 21st October**, with the half term beginning on **Friday 22nd**. The **return to school** will be as normal on **Monday 1st November**.



Doodle Maths is an app that allows children to practise their mathematical skills independently, both in school and at home. **Doodle Maths** works by assessing areas of maths that children complete easily or find challenging; it then re-assigns questions to teach children new mathematical learning in small steps.

Your child has been given a **username** and **password**, and has been shown how to log in and use **Doodle Maths**.

It is very important that children complete the activities on **Doodle Maths** independently so that the app can assess which areas they need further practice in. Please do not help your children by giving them the answers, but direct them to the hints and explanations that can be found in the help section at the top of each question.

To link with your child's account, follow these simple steps:

- Download the **Doodle Maths** app;
- Ask your child to sign in, using the details they have been given;
- Tap on the Grown Ups section and follow the instructions there to link yourself to your child;
- Login to <u>www.parents.doodlemaths.com</u> with your Grown Ups username and password and click on Monitor Live so you can see how your child is doing as they complete their exercise; and

• Download the Parent Connect app where you can see a snapshot of what your child is doing. Encourage your child/ren to earn at least 50 Doodle Stars a week and get instant updates through your app.

Your child has been given a **username** and **password**, and has been shown how to log in and use **Doodle Maths**. Please ask your class teacher if you need a reminder.

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
