Duties:

The Class Teacher will:

- teach a class of pupils, and ensure that planning, preparation, recording, assessment and reporting meet their varying learning and social needs;
- maintain the positive ethos and core values of the school, both inside and outside the classroom;
- work constructively with teaching and non-teaching staff, parents and governors;
- ensure that the Department for Education's Teachers' Standards are met;
- work within the framework of agreed national legislation, school policies and guidelines;
- be committed to their own continuous professional development in accordance with the school's priorities, attending training as necessary and developing their wider impact across the school;
- support initiatives decided by the Head Teacher and staff;
- plan appropriately to meet the needs of all pupils, through differentiation of tasks;
- be able to set clear targets, based on prior attainment, for pupils' learning;
- provide a stimulating classroom environment, where resources can be accessed appropriately by all pupils;
- communicate effectively and regularly with parents on the development, progress and attainment of pupils;
- · plan and deliver assemblies;
- maintain excellent behaviour management amongst pupils, in accordance with the school's behaviour policy;
- pay careful attention to safeguarding matters, including health and safety;
